Our Lady of Good Counsel School, Gatton Religion Scope and Sequence Year 5, 2022.



Year Level Description In Year 5, students begin to appreciate the significance of community for sharing and strengthening the faith of believers, past and present, including the Church in the Australian colonies (c.1850 CE - c.1900 CE). Using a range of Biblical tools, they begin to see how the Gospel writers shaped their Gospels for particular communities. They learn about the action of the Holy Spirit in the lives of believers as they engage with a variety of texts, including Scriptural references to the Holy Spirit and the Catholic Rite of Confirmation. They develop their understanding of Christian charity and informed moral choice through an exploration of the experiences of individuals and communities, past and present. They broaden their appreciation of the significance of personal and communal prayer and worship (including the Eucharist, the Psalms, Sabbath rituals and prayers); and the wisdom of the Saints (including St Mary of the Cross MacKillop) for communities of believers. They learn about the significance of Marian prayers (including the Hail Mary, the Rosary and the Litany of Mary of Nazareth) in which believers praise God and entrust cares and petitions to Mary as mother of Jesus and mother of the Church.

Achievement Standard In Year 5, students identify ways in which faith is shared and strengthened in communities of believers, past and present. They describe ways in which believers live according to Jesus' new commandment of charity (love). They describe the significance of the wisdom writings of the saints including St Mary of the Cross MacKillop for communities of believers. They locate and record information about how pioneering Catholics in Australia (c. 1850 CE – c. 1900 CE) contributed to the preservation of faith and the shaping of particular communities including Indigenous communities. Students explain the action of the Holy Spirit in the lives of believers. They analyse information from a variety of texts including Scriptural references to the Holy Spirit and the words, symbols and actions of the Catholic Rite of Confirmation. They describe ways in which believers make and act upon informed moral choices.

Students examine Mary's role as mother of Jesus and mother of the Church. They analyse the elements and features of some Marian prayers including the Hail Mary, the Rosary and the Litany of the Mary of Nazareth to describe the role of Marian prayer in the lives of believers past and present. They use features of Gospel texts to show how the Gospel writers shaped their Gospels for particular communities. Students describe the significance of personal and communal prayer and worship including the Eucharist, the Psalms, Sabbath rituals and prayers for the lives of believers. They participate respectfully in a variety of personal and communal prayer experiences including Marian prayers especially the Hail Mary, Litany of Mary of Nazareth and the Rosary; and meditative prayer especially mantras. They participate respectfully in meditative prayer practices including praying with Rosary beads.
